The closing date for applications to reach Scouts Queensland is Friday 13th May 2005. Remember the course fee must accompany the application. All Leaders in training, regardless of previous courses completed, are eligible to attend Skills Training 1. However, only those Leaders who have completed Leadership Training and Skills Training 1 will be eligible to attend Skills Training 2.

Leadership Training and Skills Training 1 can be completed in any order. Skills Training 2 and 3 and Wood Badge Training 1,2 and 3 must be completed in sequence.

The date for the Spiritual Development Course scheduled for Friday 7th September has been changed to Friday 9th October 2005. This course runs for two and a half hours on Friday night and will provide some great ideas for incorporating the Duty to God aspect of the Scouting Fundamentals into our programs. It is also a first for our Region so let's get in early with applications and make it a good one. Iain Furby is coming up to lead the course and you will find his sessions most enjoyable. His articles in the Scout About Newsletter are well worth reading and the February one contains a powerful message.

A reminder to all, that bookings for Johnstone Lodge/kitchen/training room facilities at Rowallan Park require a \$30 deposit in order to secure the booking. All camp fees are to be paid to Caretakers Bonnie and Barry prior to departure from the campsite. It is the responsibility of all users of the Park to inform the Caretakers of their arrival and departure.

Imagine

John Lennon



Imagine there's no heaven It's easy if you try No hell below us Above us only sky Imagine all the people Living for today...

Imagine no possessions I wonder if you can

No need for greed or hunger In a brotherhood of man Imagine all the people Sharing all the world...

You may say I'm a dreamer But I'm not the only one I hope some day you'll join us And the world will be as one

Youth Group Reflection and Discussion—Imagine (45-60 minutes) (ages 14 upward)

You will need:

- 1. a candle
- 2. pens and notepad (or whiteboard/butchers paper)
- 3. CD Player and John Lennon's Imagine song
- 4. copies of the picture above either on paper or overhead (you will then need an overhead projector)
- 5. copies of the prayers.

Reflection:

- Have the youth group sit in a circle.
- Lower the lights and place a candle in the centre of group.
- Ask the group to relax and forget about the week just past and the week coming up.
- Pray the following prayer: (you may want to provide a copy for everyone to read out loud)

"On Seeing Another's Sorrow"

Lord, forgive me for becoming accustomed to looking at children who appear to be eight years old when they are already thirteen. (brief silence)

Forgive me for becoming accustomed to sloshing through mud puddles, which I can leave behind methey cannot. (brief silence)

Forgive me for learning to shut out the smell of open sewers, which I can leave behind me-they cannot. (brief silence)

Forgive me for turning on my lights automatically, forgetting those who have no lights to turn on. (brief silence)

Forgive me for telling them "Man cannot live by bread alone..." without joining them in their struggle for bread. (brief silence)

Lord, I want to love them for who they are-Help me;

I dream of dying for them-Help me to live for them;

I want to be with them when the light breaks through-Help me.

Amen.

Prayer was written by Fr. Carlos Mujica who was assassinated in May 1974 for his work against injustice. (Taken from Your Will Be Done, published by CCA Youth, 1984. Pg. 11)

After the prayer give each person a copy of the above picture, or place it on an overhead projector. Play the Imagine song, or read out loud the lyrics.

Discussion:

(You may wish to write down the answers to the questions)

- Begin with asking for general comments about the song.
- What is the song asking us to Imagine?
- Why would it be hard to Imagine what the song proposes?
- Is it harder or easier to Imagine these things at Christmas time?
- Are there people in the world who have no possessions? Who are hungry? Who experience the bad effects of greed? (you might like to read the lyrics in verse 3 out again)
- Who are those in Australia who "have not"?
- Who are the young people in Australia who "have not"?
- How can we help those who "have not"? (here is an opportunity for the youth group to take some positive action: they could do some type of fundraising for the "Christmas Bowl Appeal", prayer, raise awareness of those who "have not" through drawing posters, or writing their own Christian lyrics to the Imagine song).
- Close by playing the song again, and then pray together the following prayer (you will have to provide a copy of this prayer to your youth):

One: This is the day the Lord has made; we will rejoice and be glad in it.

All: How can we rejoice? We have brothers and sisters, all over the country, who must face issues, which may affect their rejoicing.

One: This is a day of opportunity; a time to remember all those people who face oppression and exploitation of various kinds.

All: A time to be challenged to greater action and service, to improve the conditions of all who cry out for justice.

One: This is not only a day for rejoicing, but a day to seek the truth and face the truth; a day when we must not turn away into comfortable enclaves of silence.
All: It is a day of hope that the truth will set the people free.

Yes, this is the day that the Lord has made, We will rejoice and be glad in it.

Recipes

At the Regional Leader Activity Weekend earlier this year a few leaders had a quick round table discussion on easy recipes. Here is a copy of these recipes.

Pigs in blankets- Chipolatas in Puff Pastry.

Toad on the Road – Up market version of toad in the hole but add a slice of tomato to simulate "Guts"

Flying saucers – take a hash brown take scoop of savoury mince and put in centre of hash brown cover with grated cheese pop under the grill.

Sweet version – Pineapple ring with marshmallow and melt the marshmallow under grill and then cool and add ice-magic.

Ice-cream cone cakes – Three quarter fill ice-cream cones with cake mix and cook. Ice and sprinkle with hundreds and thousands or make clown faces.

Smors- Two chocolate wheaten biscuits with two toasted marshmallows in between.

Marshmallow lollipops – take a number of marshmallows and thread them on a skewer, dip in chocolate and allow to set.

Damper Dog -Make damper mix. Place a Cheerio on the end of a water soaked skewer, and cover the cheerio with damper mix. Place on a rack and cook over coals turning often.
