# 100 Years of Scouting Celebrated

At the official ceremony Lord Mayor Campbell Newman presented the keys of the city to The Chief Commissioner Maurice Law AM.

As Central and Coastal Region scouting members had travelled a long distance, we were fortunate enough to march within the first hundred metres of the parade.

Youth members participated in activities provided for them. The Rock Wall was very popular and the scouts declared that the Museum was awesome. In the evening there was a Scout Gang Show Revue where the crowd was entertained by members of scouting.

The scouting members who didn't travel to Brisbane were not forgotten, some chose to go to Rowallan Park for a BYO barbeque and campfire.
