Region Commissioner's Report

Central and Coastal Region currently has 299 members, an increase of 4 members since last month. The number consists of: Jove Scouts 24, Cub Scouts 78, Scouts 72, Venturer Scouts 13, Rovers 12, Fellowship 20, Support NU 19, Leaders 40, Region 21.

Since our last newsletter there has been a successful Scout Leadership course held at Rowallan Park. Although numbers were down, those who participated learnt a lot and all enjoyed the weekend. Thanks to ARC Lance Hodda, ARC Dougal McWhinney, Region Leader Tim Johnston and Scout Leader Allan Salty for their efforts in making this course so enjoyable for the Scouts.

The annual Region Cub Scout Leadership course was held at Mackay City Central Scout den recently. Thanks to Region Leader Julie and her helpers for an enjoyable day.

I have attended a presentation of the Grey Wolf award for 3 Cub Scouts at Banksia Den and another Grey Wolf presentation at Mackay City Central Den. Congratulations to the participants and Leaders. A lot of time and effort goes into achieving this prestigious award.

The 54th Jamboree On The Air (JOTA) and the 15th Jamboree On The Internet (JOTI) was held on the 15-16 October. The region event (held at Rowallan Park) had around 90 youth members and leaders in attendance.

JOTA had an HF radio in operation as well as Echolink. JOTA was only operating on Saturday. Due to very noisy conditions on the day (lots of storms around) we only had a few contacts (mostly in Australia).

JOTI had around 11 PCs in operation using Internet Chat Relay (IRC) to communicate to other Scouts/Guides/Leaders. It started slowly on Saturday and we were only getting a few contacts in Australia. However by Saturday afternoon, JOTI was starting to liven up and was on fire late Saturday evening early Sunday.

Overall we made around 177 contacts across 43 countries (want to improve on this next year). The table below shows the top 5 countries we contacted.

This year we also had an electronics station where the participants could make a small 2 light flasher. There were some really excited youth members really looking forward to completing the kit and we didn't end up with too many singed fingers. Without them I am sure I would have struggled to get everything completed on time. Also thanks to the other leaders and parent helpers that provided assistance when their group was in attendance. Those who are unable to or do not wish to access the computer based or e-learning method will still be catered for as will those who are part way through the Training Program as we currently know it. As the relative information comes to hand it will be distributed throughout the Region. Mr Harvey outlined what each recipient did to achieve their Grey Wolf Award, the highest achievement in the Cub Scout section. Ms Hamilton presented all the Cub Scouts with their certificates from the Branch Commissioner for Cub Scouts.

Cub Scout Douglas Pridmore from Mackay City Central Scout Group was presented with his Grey Wolf award, the highest award in the Cub Scout section, at a special meeting held at the scout den in Lagoon Street on Thursday 17th November 2011. Region Commissioner Mr Brian Harvey presented Douglas with his certificate and Cub Scout Leader Mrs Debbie Rutherford his Grey Wolf badge.

Douglas's journey in scouting began in 2008 when he was invested as a Cub Scout. It was soon evident that he had leadership ability and was soon made a second in his pack and then a sixer. He fulfilled the role as a youth leader to a very high standard and set a positive example to follow.

Douglas was highly motivated and he completed all three Boomerang Challenge levels and gained numerous achievement badges. He was also a regular attendee of Pack Councils, ANZAC Day parades and group and region activities.

Using a map, he planned and lead a ramble of at least two hours duration with his Leader and a group of cub scouts. Part of this planning included ensuring everyone was aware of safety issues – appropriate clothing, food, and equipment requirements. The program of activities he put forward for inclusion during his Ramble along part of the Bluewater Walk was very impressive and included a compass trail with participants having to collect clues at each checkpoint and a very informative instruction on the importance of and

manner in which to sterilize water from a stream or creek.

To complete the Grey Wolf Award Douglas also had to attend a leadership course and he present the pack with a resource based on the Jungle Book.

Douglas said his highlights in the Cub Scout Section were the camps, pack holidays and canoeing.

The guests at the Grey Wolf award presentation were treated to a barbeque tea, and a special cake for the occasion.
