


# Central Coast Region Newsletter

#### **Region Commissioner's Report**

Happy New Year to everyone. Youth Membership

Youth membership growth in the region grew quite nicely from August to November but the end of year cleanout obviously started in January and we lost the ground made in the previous months. In November 2017, the region reached a peak of 708 youth members and the three areas have had mixed growth (North – 12.7%, Central – 2.4%, South – 1.1%). The total number of youth members in the region as at the middle of March was 622 comprising of 61 Joey Scouts, 242 Cub Scouts, 227 Scouts, 69 Venturer Scouts and 23 Rover Scouts. This count is up 5% since 01 April 2017.



Leader numbers have also fluctuated. At present we have 109 Leaders (section/group), 48 Support Members (Adult Members & Helpers), 12 Region Leaders and 29 Fellowship members.

#### **Region Restructure**

Well the next incantation of the region is almost upon us! The Districts are moving forward. We now have the three District Commissioners appointed, the three districts named and in the next week or so, all the transfers will occur and the Districts will become officially started on 01 April 2018.

**ROVER BOOT CEREMONY—Alex Cinelli** Rover Scout Alex Cinelli was recently booted from





# QUEEN'S SCOUT AWARD—RILEY SIMPSON

Mackay Venturer Scout Riley Simpson has earned the Queen's Scout Award and was presented with his badge at a special ceremony at Rowallan Park on Saturday 2 December 2017. Region Commissioner Mr Dougal McWhinney along with family, friends and scouting members were present to witness the presentation of this prestigious award.

To achieve that Queen's Scout Award, you must be willing to put in an enormous amount of time to achieve the requirements. Firstly, you must be a Venturer Scout, and then gain the Venturer Skills Award. You must then complete the 4 Awards areas which requires not less than 30 hours each, Community Involvement, Outdoor activities, Personal Growth and Leadership Development. Once completed the processes of approving the award from Group Level, Region Level with a personal interview with the Region Commissioner, and then to Queensland Branch for final approval. Riley began his scouting journey as a Cub Scout, where he earned the Grey Wolf Award, advanced to Scouts where he earned the Australian Scout Medallion and in May 2015 he advanced to Venturer Scouts where he has now achieved the highest award in this section as well, the Queen's Scout Award. Riley's Venturer Scout Leader Joann Brzozowski said she was privileged to witness his drive and determination. As a part of his Queen's Scout Award, Riley achieved Certificate 2 in Business as well as Outdoor Recreation. At the New Zealand Venture "Inferno" Riley was introduced to caving, he enjoyed the experience so much that he was quick to partake in Caving again at the Queensland Venture. Bat "Dwayne Kersey" who is the caving expert in the Central Coast Region invited him to another caving adventure and he has now completed his Vet Level 1 Qualifications for Caving. He has also been hiking in North Queensland and to Blackdown Tableland in Central Queensland, and to Sapphire for gem fossicking.

At the ceremony Riley thanked all that were present as everyone played some part in his Queen's Scout achievement. He made special mention of his Grandparents, his parents and his Leader Joann Brzozowski and her husband Peter, Brendan Ross Adventurous Activities Leader and Dwayne Kersey for Caving.

At the presentation Riley was also presented with the Endeavour Award. He was a part of the Bell Ringing Group where he achieved a further 50 hours in addition to the 30 hours that he was required to do. The afternoon concluded with a selection to tasty treats and a special cake to celebrate his achievement.
